



A WORD FROM THE ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL

Ladies and Gentlemen, Dear Associates,

The Admin Council met on January 5, 6, and 7, 2026. The agenda for this meeting covered a wide range of topics, and numerous decisions were made to improve the financial management, infrastructure, security, and activities of the Domaine. The coming months will be devoted to implementing these projects, with a particular focus on preparing for the 2026 season and resolving disputes.

In addition, there are four positions to be filled on the Admin Council and two on the Supervisory Council, and we invite all associates to get involved and commit to the administration and management of the Domaine, putting their skills to good use.

Furthermore, the Domaine will celebrate its 65th anniversary in 2026, and we are organising events to celebrate what our predecessors have left us, for which we are grateful. Please feel free to send us any documents (photos, films, etc.) that will help us showcase your attachment to Pin de la Lègue by telling its story (service.administratif@pindelalegue.fr).

GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

Initial assessment of the closure of the Domain:

During this period of closure, the Domain recorded 2,644 authorised entries and exits. It should be noted that these figures reflect the fact that some entries and exits were made by the same people. In total, 574 different people had access to the Domain's facilities. Peak attendance reached up to 211 entries in a single day. These were managed smoothly, ensuring both visitor access and the protection of the facilities.

Regular reminders, particularly the one sent on December 26, 2025, clarified the access procedures during this period. Although some visitors initially had questions, the majority quickly adopted best practices, demonstrating the effectiveness of communication channels (emails, news flashes) and the importance of ongoing dialogue.

The requirement to present identification, sometimes perceived as a constraint, was explained, and visitors were made aware that this was not a police check but an internal measure, in accordance with the regulations governing private property (PRL) and its statutes. This approach helped to clear up misunderstandings and build trust.

Security patrols, carried out day and night by security guards and employees dedicated to these tasks, ensured a safe environment for everyone.

From day one, constructive dialogue with two associates enabled misunderstandings to be quickly resolved, with no further incidents.

To date, no damage or malicious acts have been reported. Every effort has been made to strengthen surveillance measures to ensure optimal security while promoting collaboration between visitors, members, and security teams.

Feeding the cat population on the Domaine during closure:

An information meeting and telephone calls with volunteer members were organised with the “cat lovers” to set up a feeding program during this period of closure. These discussions resulted in:

- The purchase of bags of dry food by the S.C.I. in December 2025.
- The distribution by the S.C.I. of bags of dry food in early January 2026 to volunteer members, “cat lovers” who had been contacted in advance by the administration.
- The establishment of four sheltered feeding stations (dry food and water) by the S.C.I., distributed throughout the estate and chosen in consultation with “cat lover” members.
- An S.C.I. employee visited these four feeding stations at least four times a week to replenish the dry food and water at each station.
- A dozen volunteer members and cat lovers, who are likely to return to the estate during the closure, also fed the cats themselves, as usual, and each received a 10-kilogram bag of dry food, donated by the domain.

Dates of upcoming admin council meetings:

The next admin council meetings will take place from April 1 to 3, 2026, and from June 4 to 5, 2026.

Vacancies on the Administrative Council and Supervisory Council:

There are 4 vacancies on the Administrative Council and 2 vacancies on the Supervisory Council, for a term of 3 years. Applications must be submitted before 5 p.m. on April 2, 2026, and sent by email to joel.lavialle@pindelalegue.fr, by post to the Domaine's address (the postmark serving as proof of the date of dispatch), or delivered by hand. They must be accompanied by a statement of intent and a CV.

Ms. VIENNET, Ms. MERLOT, and Mr. HOLLE are stepping down.

As a reminder, the CA is obligated to:

- comply with applicable laws, regulations, and current administrative texts.
- enforce the bylaws and internal regulations.
- convene general assemblies and comply with their decisions.

The Supervisory Council is:

- responsible for auditing all the company's accounts and carrying out any audits or checks it deems appropriate at any time of the year. It will report to either the President of the Admin. Council, the Administrator of reference or the General Manager.
- For any personnel-related matters, they shall refer to either the President of the Administrative Council or, in their absence, the General Manager.

FINANCES

Financial statement:

Our financial situation at the start of 2026 stands at approximately €2,930,000 between current accounts and term deposits (DAT), which is stable compared to 2024, when it stood at €2,895,000.

Our 2025 balance sheet is currently being prepared and will be reviewed at the next CA meeting.

During our CA meeting in January 2026, we verified that the Multi-Year Plan for 2023-2028 was being followed. As some of the previously approved work has become obsolete, other work that better meets our needs will be proposed. These proposals will be put to a vote at the General Assembly in 2026.

Presence of the auditor:

The auditor's regular attendance at CA meetings allows us to approach the various aspects of financial matters with confidence. Their expert advice helps to guide decisions in accordance with the law.

Financial disputes:

The summons of associates who had not paid their fees for large amounts enabled amicable solutions to be found, and the CA members will repeat this process at each of their meetings to reduce debts and avoid contentious proceedings as far as possible.

The other litigation cases mentioned at the last AGM are still ongoing.

Ms. and Mr. Mayer cases:

The Aix-en-Provence Court of Appeal ruled on the dispute between SCI and Mr. and Mrs. Mayer in judgments on the merits dated January 16, 2026 (Nos. 2026/25 and 27). The plaintiffs have two months to appeal, and we will therefore be able to provide further information on the outcome of these two cases from March 2026 onwards.

Approvals:

In 2025, 145 transactions were completed, including 100 share transfers. 16 approvals were refused.

WORKS AND DEVELOPMENTS

Village square:

It was decided to continue equipping the village square with furniture, adding lighting, armchairs, and sofas. In addition, the five game tables (chess, checkers, goose, horses) mentioned at the previous council meeting will be installed near the square.

P'tits Loups:

A complete renovation of the "little children" area is planned. The replacement of the tiles, which are considered too slippery, or their covering with synthetic turf will be carried out this year. Furthermore, the success of the P'tits Loups activities has led to the recruitment of an additional seasonal worker, for which a position is open to BAFA-certified candidates. As a reminder, the legal supervision ratio is one adult for every eight children under the age of six and one adult for every twelve children over the age of six.

Sports facilities:

Work on the volleyball, beach volleyball (addition of sand), basketball (purchase of new backboards and refurbishment of the court) and CrossFit (enlargement of the area) courts has been completed or is nearing completion. Discussions are underway to determine the best solution for refurbishing tennis court number 9, which is the only one with lighting. There are several types of surface available, and the solution will be based on playing comfort, ease of

maintenance, and, of course, the cost of the work. The creation of a new padel court is under discussion for 2027.

Dog park:

The dog park has been installed. The rules and regulations for its use are currently being drafted. Dog waste bags will be provided.

Boules court:

The area in front of the terrace has been renovated in accordance with the players' requests.

Aquatic area:

The “children/families” area has been sanded down. A working group dedicated to the development of the aquatic area has been set up within the council.

Gonfaron:

As agreed and reiterated in our various news flashes and at meetings held in 2025, the public inquiry, a legal and mandatory procedure in the Gonfaron case, was held between January 12 and February 11. The information was communicated via the usual channels of public notices and the press and posted on the Domaine's website. The surveyor has submitted the results of his measurements and the file relating to the acquisition of the land is progressing. Work on installing the debris barrier is expected to begin next winter. The Gonfaron flow monitoring system is operational. It is now possible to monitor changes in the river in real time and anticipate any potential flooding. A problem with the system's solar panel power supply is currently being discussed with TENEVIA. A solution will be found quickly. In addition, the improvements to the Gonfaron river requested by residents and approved by Hydratec have all been completed.

Using infrared cameras managed by artificial intelligence, we can now monitor climate changes in real time. This equipment provides us with immediate information on the height and speed of the flows as well as the degree of opening of the grids. We will soon have detailed weather forecasts using the same process, which will enable us to anticipate the meteorological impacts on the watershed directly linked to our domaine.

Assessment of work to be carried out in the ravines:

SOCOTEC has been commissioned to take around 10 soil and waste samples from the ravines. The results of the sample analysis will determine the nature of the work to be carried out, the associated costs, and the preparation of updated estimates.

PPRIF 2:

PPRIF 2, which concerns the common areas, will be carried out by EL Forestier for a total of €193,444 excluding VAT over a three-year period from 2027 to 2029. This decision will be put to a vote at the next AGM.

Lodge:

The interior and exterior work on the lodge was completed on schedule. It will improve the welcome for visitors and enable faster and more efficient management of entry to the estate. A pergola has been installed to make waiting conditions more pleasant. Its final layout is scheduled for completion in the 2026 season.

Landscaping of the Domaine and Ecological Conversion Plan:

We have received the first estimates for the Domaine's beautification work. Vert Design et Création will submit landscaping proposals with 3D visuals (15 areas identified during the November 27, 2025, visit to the Domaine and the median strip on Route RD 4). It has been decided to include the Domaine's beautification work within the broader framework of the Ecological Conversion Plan, which will be the subject of a multi-year program based on the PPA model. While most of the work will be outsourced, technical service agents will be systematically consulted and involved in the choices of work selected and included in our CSR (Corporate Social Responsibility) approach.

Undeclared work and site visits:

Several associates carried out work without first submitting a request to the technical services department. Furthermore, in several cases, the work carried out does not correspond to that specified in the initial request. The work will be required to be brought into compliance. The recruitment of Ms. Julie BOUDINELLE, who succeeds Mr. Jean-Claude DUSNASIO in these duties, will allow visits to resume, with priority given to those that are subject to transfers.

Maintenance of plots:

Despite reminders, many plots are not being maintained properly and regularly, which creates a risk of brush fires. The internal regulations state that brush clearing work may be carried out by external companies and that the invoice may be sent to the associates concerned. We note that this procedure is not being applied sufficiently, which poses a safety risk. In the future, the technical department will be more demanding in its checks and the procedures for intervention by external service providers will be more frequent.

Installation of electric charging stations: parking area next to the ATM

Quotes have been obtained for the installation of electric charging stations. It is possible to install two stations that will be able to charge four vehicles at the same time. The technical constraints are minimal, so installation is straightforward. However, the contracts currently on offer require a 10-year commitment from the Domaine, which we feel is far too long. We are currently considering our options and continuing our search for the best possible service.

Illegal parking:

Particularly during the peak summer season, many vehicles park on the green spaces near the mobile homes. We therefore plan to place rocks in the areas concerned to prevent access.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Update and adaptation of ODOO software:

The closure period of the Domain allowed us to successfully complete testing of V19 of the software. The aim of this “crash test” is to verify the functionality of new features integrated into this latest version. One of the improvements envisaged is to enable payment by credit card via the website, which will reduce the handling of cash and allow transactions to be digitalised, making them easier to track.

Phone calls:

Improvements are also being made to the management of phone calls to access the various services, in collaboration with managers at Isiscom, our IT service provider for VoIP (Voice over Internet Protocol) management.

Equipment acquisition:

The new card and badge printers have arrived. They are very efficient and perfectly meet the expected improvements. We plan to equip the Information Point with our old computers that are still in working order.

Archiving and GDPR:

Archiving is continuing and progressing as planned. GDPR-related procedures are being implemented satisfactorily, although the updating of registers could still be improved. Among other things, INKVARI offers dematerialized registers, which could be useful for improving monitoring. A quote has been submitted to the Board for this web application.

Orange email problem:

For over a year, members with an @orange email address were unable to contact the Domain's services, which resulted in numerous problems with booking stays, accounting, and administrative disorder. Contact was established with the management of Orange Grand Sud-Est and the problem has now been resolved.

Seasonal worker recruitment:

Ten applications for the positions of MNS and BEESAN were received. It was decided that the pool manager, Mr. Gérald MARTON, would be involved in the recruitment process.

The hiring of an additional full-time seasonal worker was decided for Les P'tits Loups in order to meet growing demand from parents and also to offer activities for teenagers who are more interested in activities less focused on sports.

Three seasonal sports instructors were recruited, as well as three seasonal workers for the lodge, two for the information desk, and one for the technical department.

Activities related to behavioral risk prevention:

At the previous CA meeting, it was decided to implement interventions aimed at young people in the areas of road safety and alcohol consumption. To meet these needs, associations dedicated to these areas will be contacted and their interventions planned.

In addition, the initiatives of an environmental mediator implemented last year in the field of ecology and the protection of flora and fauna will be continued. These initiatives are part of the estate's ecological conversion plan.

Cinema:

The balance sheet presented for the 2026 season shows a deficit, which has been consistent for several years. The CA's assessment is that the programming was of poor quality last season and was mainly aimed at a “young” or even “child” audience. However, as cinema is one of the Domaine's long-standing services, the planned equipment purchases will go ahead and the contract with the service provider will be renewed.

Tennis and padel reservation procedures:

Court reservations will be for one hour in July and August and one and a half hours during the rest of the year.

We are also considering implementing a reservation system tailored to the specific characteristics of the Domaine.

HUMAN RESOURCES MANAGEMENT

Staffing and hiring:

Hiring of Ms. Julie BOUDINELLE, land consolidation instructor to replace Mr. DUSNASIO, Mr. Philippe MANENT, general manager, and a security guard on April 1.

Aquatic area entrance security:

As the security arrangements at the entrance to the aquatic area proved satisfactory last season, the system put in place in 2025 will be continued. An additional security guard will be assigned to this area from May.

Wild boars:

The authorisation to eradicate wild boars is renewed every two months by the Var prefecture. Eight have been captured and eliminated since the beginning of the year.

Hamlet representatives:

Three new hamlet representatives have been appointed (Recantounet, Parpaiou, Castelet) and one has stepped down (Cascaveu). We therefore currently have 34 hamlet representatives in office. Their presence is invaluable and provides a better understanding of the situations faced by members and their guests.

Domain Commission for the Future:

A summary of the projects was provided by the commission chair. The following projects are under consideration: Introduction of a shuttle bus within the Domain; development of the interactive map already available on the Domain website under the “practical information” section; energy management and conservation; Reforestation (this project is part of the Domain's ecological conversion plan); “Pump track”: the project has been abandoned for technical and cost reasons; Setting up a permanent exhibition (this project will be linked to the renovation of the entrance to the administrative building); Management of waste bins; Entrances to hamlets; Relay points; Beehives.

Delivery of the macaron:

We remind you that the macaron will only be issued upon presentation of a tax certificate and insurance of your installations (Main Housing Tax available on the tax office website in the « property » section and/or Housing Tax for your main residence and/or Housing Tax for the Domaine addressed to your main residence or Income Taxes addressed to your main residence only).

If you cannot prove that you have a main residence, you will be concerned by resolution 7 voted at the general meeting of 08.14.2021 which stipulates "a partner who cannot prove, by producing a tax certificate, a main residence outside the Estate, will be penalized with a monthly penalty of 7 base rates for the first year, penalty doubled each year until regularization »

Insurance:

We remind associates of the obligation, each year when presenting the badge, to present proof of insurance for the vehicle(s), accompanied by the liability and fire insurance certificate for all of the vehicles. Their facilities.

At the request of our insurance company, associates whose two-wheelers remain parked at the store must provide us each year with their valid insurance certificate for the stored vehicle.

Sanitary facilities:

The sanitary facilities will open from Saturday, April 4, 2026

Selective sorting:

To meet the ecological challenges of sorting and recycling, but also for budgetary reasons, we ask associates to sort their waste. An information leaflet is available at the administrative office and on the website's blog.

Compost bin:

5 compost bins are available during the opening hours of the recycling center.

Trash containers:

Bins will be returned to the hamlets during the first week of June and will remain in place until September 30, 2026. **Failure to properly sort waste in the bins will result in additional charges billed to the Domaine.**

Dumpster with "monsters":

Until March 31, 2026, only on Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

Parking for motorhomes, boats and trailers:

Motorhome boats and trailers are not authorized to park permanently during the winter period in the Domaine in public car parks. If the partner has a suitable location on his/her plot, he/she is authorized to park his/her vehicles if they do not encroach on the public domaine and do not hinder possible access to their property. Plot by the fire services.

In winter, a campervan may prove to be the associate's main vehicle. In this case only, if it is not possible to park it on his plot, he must, after a prior request specifying the planned parking time, park it in a strictly demarcated area which will be specified each year by the technical services of the Domaine. This parking is only reserved for associates present in the Domaine during the same period. Checks will take place to ensure that the associate is present.

Two-wheeler store:

The drop-off or return of two-wheelers will take place from Monday to Friday, **by appointment** contact Mr. Stéphane DAVAL (the post-man) in advance at the administrative office.

“Buffer” vehicles:

For all “buffer” vehicles on the plot, without a badge and whose insurance is not up to date or non-existent, the Domaine will ask the partner concerned to communicate by e-mail the certificate of insurance.

Water meter:

Each associate is responsible for maintaining his or her own meter and manhole, and in the event of replacement, which can only be decided and carried out by the Domaine, the costs incurred will be billed to the associate concerned. In order to prevent water leaks and to put an end to disputes between associates and the Domaine's administration, the admin. council recommends that each associates have a valve installed after the meter. In the absence of such a valve, it will not be possible to establish that any overconsumption is due to a leak from our valve located before the meter.

Ditches maintenance:

You must regularly maintain the ditches. They must be cleaned and dredged and the leaves removed (watch out for plane trees). Pruned branches must not be placed in the ditches.

Facility maintenance:

We remind you that you must regularly clean your plots and pine needles on the roof of your facilities.

Maintenance of plots as part of the PPRIF program:

This work must be done regularly (please refer to the Internal Construction Regulations).

Palm treatment and disease:

Every partner with one or more palm trees on her/his parcel must contact the technical services in order to collect information relating to the treatment, felling and removal of sick palm trees. Only authorised companies may be involved, with no involvement of the Domaine's services under any circumstances.

Animals: Extracts from the internal regulations “administrative part” (UPDATE in April 2022) :

- DOMESTIC ANIMALS: (article 6.3 e)

The presence of domestic animals is authorized with their master, provided that they are vaccinated (keep the vaccination certificate available) and that they do not cause any nuisance of any kind.

Category 1 and 2 dogs are strictly prohibited at the Domaine.

Dogs must be, always, under the control of their master, attached or kept on a leash, or even muzzled according to the legislation. Under no circumstances should they be left alone on the plots. Dog owners must take all useful measures to prevent their animal from barking and making noises (see Art. 6.3. c).

Access to the nautical area and play areas is prohibited (sanitary conditions).

Owners are required to collect their animals' droppings; financial sanctions in the event of a breach (see Art.7.3.2).

Stray animals will be caught and handed over to the departmental pound service.

Cats: We remind you that a campaign to sterilize stray cats is organized all year round by volunteer associates with the agreement of the Domaine administration to avoid feline proliferation.

- PEST ANIMALS: According to the prefectural decree of May 30, 2017, the wild boar is classified as harmful throughout the Var department. As such, any person caught feeding a wild boar is liable to a fine of €135 applied by the Wildlife Office.

Registering your pets during your stays:

In order to comply with legislation on companion animals, a dedicated module has been developed and is now fully operational.

You will be required to use this module to fill in information about your pets, including their recent photograph, their microchip or tattoo number, and their up to date vaccination records.

The Domaine post-office:

Until June 29, 2026, the counter will be open to the public : from Monday to Friday, from 11 a.m to 12 p.m.

Mail, packages (Colissimo, Chronopost and DPD) as well as delivery notices for registered letters are delivered daily to mailboxes.

Fire extinguishers, fire hydrants, fire hose reel:

All equipment is inspected annually.

Military grounds around the Domaine:

Their access is strictly prohibited.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Smoke detector:

Its installation has become compulsory in mobile homes and caravans since March 8, 2015. Do not forget to change the batteries of the device in order to avoid, in your absence, an untimely triggering which could cause inconvenience to the neighborhood.

Sirens alarms in case of evacuation (fire and flood):

1 ring of 5 minutes. Please note: Every first Wednesday of the month at 12 p.m. a test is carried out on the sirens (1 ring of 1 to 2 minutes), as well as on the public address messages (see “safety instructions” below).

Evacuation plan:

The plan of the Domaine will be given to each resident in two copies when the badge is issued; One copy that the resident must keep in his vehicle and the other in his facilities. This plan will also be made available to residents in different areas of the Domaine and can be downloaded from the Domaine website.

Emergency alert:

An emergency alert transmitter and receiver is installed at each sanitary facility in direct connection with the lodge. The latter must be used in the event of a fire or serious incident.

- IN CASE OF FIRE -

- If you witness a fire starting:
 - Call the firefighters on 18 or 112,
 - Inform the entry point:
 - either by telephone by dialing **07.78.48.54.55 (preferred number) or 04.98.11.84.40,**
 - or by means of the call terminal located in the sanitary block.

Do not hang up first, wait for confirmation of your call.
- Identify yourself by giving your name, the address of your plot in the Domaine (hamlet name + number).
- Communicate the location, nature, and extent of the disaster.
- Specify whether there are victims, the visual state of injuries or burns.
- Close the gas bottles, cut off the electricity to the affected area, use fire extinguishers and/or garden hoses.
- As far as possible (do not put your life in danger), stay on the scene to guide emergency services and set up a security perimeter.

- IN CASE OF FLOOD -

- Inform the entry post:
 - Either by telephone by dialing **07.78.48.54.55 (preferred number) or 04.98.11.84.40,**
 - Or by means of the call terminal located in the sanitary block.

Do not hang up first, wait for confirmation of your call.
- Identify yourself by giving your name, the address of your plot in the Domaine (hamlet name + number).
- Communicate the location, nature, and extent of the disaster.
- Specify, if necessary, whether people need to be taken care of.
- Take shelter in a higher place.
- Never cross a road or path submerged in water.

- EVACUATION OF THE AREA –

- The evacuation order is given by the Domaine sirens and/or public address messages.
- Close the gas bottles, cut off the electricity.
- Close the doors and windows of your installations to prevent theft and the spread of fire or smoke inside mobile homes or caravans.
- **BE CAREFUL** do not turn off the water on the plot, leave the watering hoses available.
- Take identity papers, health records, emergency medicines, shoes, clothes and drinks.
- Evacuate the Estate with vehicles without a trailer, following the marked circuits.
- Follow directions given by security personnel or utilities.
- Anyone present in the Domaine **must** evacuate under penalty of sanction.
- If a resident takes care of one or more people (children, or disabled people), they are asked to inform the entrance post to report it.

- FIRST AID PROCEDURES –

- If you witness an accident, faintness or illness:
 - Observe.
 - Protect to avoid secondary accidents.
 - Alert the firefighters at 18 or 112, or the SAMU at 15:
 - Identify yourself by providing your name and telephone number,
 - Indicate the nature of the problem: accident, discomfort or illness,
 - Indicate the exact location of the event,
 - Specify the number of people concerned,
 - Specify the apparent condition of the victim or each victim, their age and sex,
 - Indicate the first measures taken.
 - Never hang up first;
 - Notify the entrance post to indicate that help will arrive:
 - Either by telephone by dialing **07.78.48.54.55 (preferred number) or 04.98.11.84.40,**
 - Either by means of the call terminal located in the sanitary block,
 - Or by any other means of communication.
 - Stay with the victim(s).
